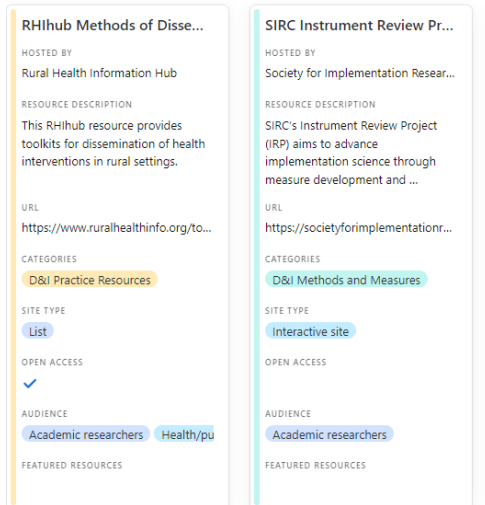


The resources, or web resource catalogs, are categorized under the following domains:

- D&I Comprehensive Resources
- D&I CTSA Infrastructure and Processes
- D&I Funding Opportunities and Resources
- D&I Health Equity and DEI
- D&I Methods and Measures
- D&I Practice Resources
- D&I Theories, Models, and Frameworks
- D&I Training and Workforce Development

The resources are organized on color-coded cards corresponding to these domains. (Figure 1)

Each card contains the title of the compilation in bold at the top; the institution host; a brief description; and the URL, which you can click on directly to visit the site. Information on how the resource is categorized, the site type, and the audience is also provided.

The D&I Catalog can be explored using the **Filter function** with options to filter by several characteristics including category, host, site type, audience. If you have a specific purpose in mind, such as finding funding or training resources, **filtering** the compilations **by category** can help you find it faster.

The sort feature can also help you find a category by sorting the cards so they are displayed in a specific order based on the sorting variable. For example, sorting on "category" would group all the cards within the same category together.
